Strong clinical decision making is essential in the delivery of safe, effective and person centred care. The effective practitioner carefully considers the interventions required for the people in their care so a strong understanding of the clinical decision process making is essential.

Clinical Decision Making - Effective Practitioner

Clinical decision-making can be defined as the process nurses use to gather patient information, evaluate that information and make a judgement which results in the provision of patient care (White et al. 1992). This process involves collecting information with the use of both scientific and intuitive assessment skills.

Evidence-based decision making involves combining the knowledge arising from one’s clinical expertise, patient preferences, and research evidence within the context of available resources. 11 Evidence-based decision making—like all decision making—involves choosing from a discrete range of options, which may include doing nothing or a “wait and see” strategy. All such choices are informed by an evaluation of available information: the process of using clinical judgment.

(O’Reilly, 1993) Clinical decision-making is defined as the ability to sift and synthesize information, make decisions, and appropriately implement those decisions within a clinical setting.
