BACKGROUND In June of 1988, approximately forty scholars and researchers met for four days in the Leeuwenborst Congress Center in Noordwijkerhout, The Netherlands, to participate in a workshop entitled Self-Report Methodology in Criminological Research. The participants represented 15 nations and 30 universities and research centers, a diversity that was matched by the experiences and focal interests in self-report methods among the participants.
