

Fluid Resuscitation Mcq

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Initial resuscitation boluses of 20ml/kg of normal saline can be used. For maintenance IV fluid 5% dextrose and 0.9% Normal Saline can be used, remembering to correct potassium. For oral rehydration Gastrolyte and similar products may be used. How quickly to rehydrate. In a resuscitation situation, obviously fluids will be given quickly.
