Enoxaparin (Lovenox®) is administered only by injection under the skin using a small needle and syringe. Injections can be given once or twice a day.

If you gave yourself an injection of Lovenox, press the plunger down firmly. The needle guard should slide into place on its own. If you gave yourself an injection of any medication besides Lovenox, hold the clear plastic finger grips on the sides of the syringe with one hand. Hold the needle guard with your other hand (see Figure 5).

Here are step-by-step instructions for taking Lovenox™ (enoxaparin) injections: Lovenox™ is injected subcutaneously-or into the fatty tissue under your skin. The primary sites for injection are your abdomen – 2 inches on either side of the navel.

An injection of a blood thinner is likely to cause a bruise because the injection can damage the skin and the thinned blood is easier to leak out. Therefore this is expected. This rarely can be a sign of "over thinned" blood. This means you are taking too high of a dose of lovenox or the injections are causing a problem. I woudl recommend rotating the site of your injection and talking to your ...

Should I be worried about bruising following a Lovenox ...

Ultimately, the site of injection is up to you. To decide, you may want to consider the discomfort involved and possible bruising. Don't give yourself a shot into any area of your body that is bruised, swollen, or tender. Don't give your Heparin shot within 1 inch (2.54 cm) of a scar or 2 inches (5.08 cm) of your bellybutton. ...
