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Blank's Levels of Questioning is a questioning framework developed by Marion Blank, a renowned psychologist. There are four levels of questioning which move from simple, concrete questions to more difficult, abstract questions. Blank's questions encourage development of

Marion Blank set out her Language Levels (I-IV) to show the way children move from answering very direct questions to grasping more abstract ideas by 5+y. Assessments developed from her work stress the importance of looking not just at whether the child's answer is technically correct. It is vital to judge whether the child has...

Marion Blank created four levels of questioning: Matching Perception - Reporting and responding to salient information. The objects being discussed are in front of the child or have just been removed. The statements are directly related to the material just seen and the questions may need only a very short or non-verbal response such as pointing.

Dr Blank proposed that children learn language through social interaction, including through the way they listen to and speak with others while engaged in activities together." \* Four Levels of Abstraction. Level One: At level one, the language complexity is where there is directly supplied information or matching perception. This is where a child matches pictures, sights or sounds to label objects.

BLANK level questions. I was introduced to BLANK level questions many years ago as part of a whole school push on Communication development. This simple strategy completely changed the way that I interact with children in the Early Years (particularly with 2, 3 and 4 year olds). BLANK level questions were devised by Dr Marion Blank as a way to structure questions at different levels of understanding, ranging from 1 (simple one word answers) to level 4 which require reasoning.

The Marion Blank Language Levels I-IV move from very direct questioning (approx. 3y but appropriate for older children with impaired/delayed language skills) towards much more abstract work (5+y). Each of the four scenes in the story has questions at each Level.

Blank levels of questioning. Marion Blank described four levels of understanding that children move through. Level 1 is the most concrete, moving up to Level 4, which is the most abstract. Children's understanding develops following this order.

At Level 4, the child often needs to draw on past knowledge or experience. Levels of questioning in the classroom Blank, Rose and Berlin (1978) devised a language analysis based on four levels, ranging from basic skills at level one to more complex reasoning skills at level four. The emphasis in this model is on how the adult talks to the child.

She found that there were four different levels of questions used. Basic questions ask for simple concrete information whereas more complex questions ask for abstract information.

From this perspective, Marion Blank (2002) has theorized four levels of language and reasoning that are hierarchical and that can be progressed using child and adult dialogue and talk. Examples are presented on how these four levels can be incorporated into early childhood learning settings.

Marion Blank's levels of language are concerned with are four different levels of questioning; Naming, Describing, Retelling/Narrative and Justifying. The levels are graded in complexity and go from understanding concrete questions to more abstract questioning and inferencing.
